#### **Mayhill Habit**

Each half term has a different Mayhill Habit which the children will enquire into, develop a deeper understanding of and be able to explain how they are able to apply this habit into their own learning and life. This half-term's habit of focus is **CRITICAL THINKING.** 

#### English

Our text this half term is 'The fastest boy in the world' by Elizabeth Laird, which follows the journey of Solomon and his family as he strives to achieve his running dreams! The children will be creating a news report all about Solomon and his running achievements. The children will present this verbally and we hope to upload some of these videos to the website blog to showcase the magnificent writing and performance skills ahead of our production. Alongside this, we will use the same familiar text to write a diary entry as the character of Solomon.

#### Maths

Moving on from adding and subtracting four-digit numbers, children will use their knowledge to solve addition and subtraction two-step problems in contexts and will practise choosing the correct number operations and methods. We will look at using the inverse operation to check answers and make links between rounding and estimating. We will move on to learning different methods for multiplication and the meaning of terms such as factors and multiples. A focus will also be placed on beginning to know the inverse relationships for times tables facts.

Please can you support your child by encouraging them to log on to **Times Tables Rock Stars** for regular times tables practice. There is a whole school TTRS competition coming up in week commencing the 13<sup>th</sup> November.

### Science and DT

This half term our scientific focus will be on electricity. We will look at different sources of electricity and which sources are needed for electronic devices to work. This will be a very practical topic with lots of circuit making and investigating conductive materials, while exploring different sources of electricity.
