Vikings: Traders or Raiders?




Our enquiry question for history this half term is: 'Were the Vikings just raiders?' We will be continuing our timeline after the Anglo-Saxons with the arrival of the Vikings. We will look at stereotypical views of Vikings verses reality based on primary and secondary sources, looking at various Viking long boats and investigating why there is such a negative image around them. To present our findings we will be adding to a personal zig-zag book each lesson, building up our knowledge. Before finishing off with a class treasure hunt for Viking evidence.

Mayhill Habit



Each half term has a different Mayhill Habit which the children will enquire into, develop a deeper understanding of and be able to explain how they are able to apply this habit into their own learning and life. This half-term's habit of focus is **RESILIENCE.**

English



Our first text this half term is "Viking Myths" by Jacqueline Morley, which is an anthology of some of the most gripping and memorable stories of Norse mythology. The children will be writing a diary entry as Loki, the mischief maker and then their own narrative in a style of a Viking myth. In our Guided Reading lessons, we will be focussing on themes and conventions in a variety of different text styles by using dictionaries, Viking myths, scientific biographies and other non-fiction information texts.

Science

Our science focus continues to be the ear. We have tracked sounds and created modelling clay ears to understand how the ear works. This term we will be focussing on investigations; by collecting decibel and hertz readings using data loggers on the ipads. We will be looking at how sound travels and how we can change this e.g. muffle or stop the sound.



Maths

Moving on from last half term's multiplication and division, we will be introducing the concept of area and how this can be calculated using squares as a unit of measure. Following this, the Maths for this half term is focused on fractions (including decimals) we will be recapping any learning that was taught during Year 3. By recapping, the children should feel confident in progressing into fractions of amounts involving problem solving.



Please can you support your child by ensuring they complete their maths homework each week and encouraging them to log on to Times Tables Rock Stars for regular times tables practice. Later on this year, year 4 will be completing the MTC (Multiplication and Tables Check) set by government. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/multiplication-tables-check-information-for-parents-text-version--2
